CERTIFICATE OF INCORPORATION

OF THE

MAPLEWOOD CEMETERY ASSOCIATION.

We, the undersigned, who were present at a meeting held at the residence of Thomas O. Jones in the Town of Henrietta, County of Monroe, and State of New York, on the 29th day of February, 1896, do hereby certify that the following named persons and all residing in the State of New York, namely William B. Titus, Miss Cora M. Jones, Mrs. J. Avinia S. Holcomb, Mrs. Irving Terry, Mrs. Emma F. Martin, Frank O. Titus, Mrs. Mary Parsons, Thomas O. Jones, John Krohn, Charles W. Zornow, Wallman, Daniel W. Daw, Watson D. Holcomb, and Herbert M. Clark, all residing in the Town of Henrietta, County of Monroe, New York, and Harvey F. Remington residing in the city of Rochester, Monroe County, New York, and all being desirous of forming an association for the purpose of procuring and holding lands in the Town of Henrietta, County of Monroe, New York, to be used exclusively for a cemetery or place of burial of the dead, and for the purpose of incorporating an association to conduct the affairs pertaining to or connected with a cemetery in the Town of Henrietta, previously known as the Maplewood cemetery in which the lots were held by individual members, and for the conduct and management of such cemetery no corporation or association having ever previously existed; did hold a meeting at the said residence of Thomas O. Jones in the Town of Henrietta, Monroe County, New York on said 29th day

of February, 1896; that thirty days prior to such meeting notice was duly given to all persons owning lots in what was known as the Maplewood Cemetery in the Town of Henrietta; that it was the intention to incorporate an association for the purpose of conducting the affairs of such cemetery. That all of the above named persons were present at the said meeting, in pursuance of a notice given to them thirty days prior to said 29th day of February, 1896, and that the time and place of the said meeting was agreed upon by all of the said persons, who did then and there, by a unanimous vote, decide to incorporate a cemetery association as hereinafter detailed. That by a unanimous vote the said meeting did appoint Henry U. Martin as Chairman and William E. Titus as secretary of said meeting.

That at the said meeting the persons composed and present at the same did thereupon proceed to form an association under the Laws of the State of New York, for the purpose of procuring and holding lands in the said Town of Henrietta, and to be used exclusively for a cemetery or place for the burial of the dead, and for the purpose of holding the lots previously existing in the said Maplewood Cemetery exclusively for such cemetery, or place for the burial of the dead, and did further determine as follows:

FIRST, That the said cemetery was to be situated in the Town of Henrietta, County of Monroe, and State of New York.

SECOND. That the corporate name of said cemetery, determined upon at the said meeting was, The Maplewood Cemetery Association.

THIRD. That it was then and there further determined that the annual meeting of said association should be held on the third Saturday in the month of October in each year.

FOURTH. That the number of directors to manage the concerns of the said association, should be six, and the said number of six was fixed on for that purpose. That thereupon the said meeting and the persons composing and present at the same proceeded to select the following named as directors of said association, until others are elected in their place.

Herbert M. Clark, residing in the Town of Henrietta, Monroe County, New York; Mrs. Sarah Post, residing in the Town of Henrietta, Monroe County, New York; Parvey F. Remington, residing in the City of Rochester, Monroe County, New York; William S. Dunn, residing in the Town of Henrietta, Monroe County, New York; William B. Titus, residing in the Town of Henrietta, Monroe County, New York, and Mrs. Emma F. Martin, residing in the Town of Henrietta, Monroe County, New York. The said meeting did determine that said Trustees should be divided into three classes, as follows:

I. Herbert Clark and Mrs. Sarah Post in the first class, to hold office until the first annual meeting thereafter.

II. Parvey F. Remington and William S. Dunn in the second class, to hold office until the second annual meeting thereafter.

III. William B. Titus and Mrs. Emma F. Martin in
the third class, to hold office until the third annual meeting
thereafter.
